# 1. Explanations

The text passages are according to the following Bible translation: Authorized King James Version of the Holy Bible, Oxford University Press.

If in this listing the numbers are given in digits and not in words, then they are according to the Samaritian Thora and not according to the Masoretian Pentateuch having another number in this case. This property stresses the correctness of the statements in Jeremiah 8:8 and Matthew 5:18:

8. How do ye say, We [are] wise, and the law of the LORD [is] with us? Lo, certainly in vain made he [it]; the pen of the scribes [is] in vain. (Jeremiah 8:8)

18. For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled. (Matthew 5:18)

The Holy Bible also can be used as a tutorial of mathematics especially for historians, but of course the main intension of this book is the call for repentance to us being sinners, because of whom the son of God came down from heaven and died on the cross.

It takes a lot of time to work on the biblical chronology thus the actual start of the scientific work is a consideration of the bordery limits according to Psalm 90, where Moses has prayed:

12. So teach [us] to number our days, that we may apply [our] hearts unto wisdom. (Psalm 90:12)

- 9. Then shalt thou cause the trumpet of the jubile to sound on the tenth [day] of the seventh month, in the day of atonement shall ye make the trumpet sound throughout all your land.
- 10. And ye shall hallow the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty throughout [all] the land unto all the inhabitants thereof: it shall be a jubile unto you; and ye shall return every man unto his possession, and ye shall return every man unto his family.
- 11. A jubile shall that fiftieth year be unto you: ye shall not sow, neither reap that which groweth of itself in it, nor gather [the grapes] in it of thy vine undressed.

- 20. And if ye shall say, What shall we eat the seventh year? behold, we shall not sow, nor gather in our increase:
- 21. Then I will command my blessing upon you in the sixth year, and it shall bring forth fruit for three years.
- 22. And ye shall sow the eighth year, and eat [yet] of old fruit until the ninth year; until her fruits come in ye shall eat [of] the old [store].

# **Numbers 10**

- 6. Then the children of Judah came unto Joshua in Gilgal: and Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenezite said unto him, Thou knowest the thing that the LORD said unto Moses the man of God concerning me and thee in Kadeshbarnea.
- 7. Forty years old [was] I when Moses the servant of the LORD sent me from Kadeshbarnea to espy out the land; and I brought him word again as [it was] in mine heart.
- 10. And now, behold, the LORD hath kept me alive, as he said, these forty and five years, even since the LORD spake this word unto Moses, while [the children of] Israel wandered in the wilderness: and now, lo, I [am] this day fourscore and five years old.

### Joshua 24

29. And it came to pass after these things, that Joshua the son of Nun, the servant of the LORD, died, [being] an hundred and ten years old.

# Judges 2

- 8. And Joshua the son of Nun, the servant of the LORD, died, [being] an hundred and ten years old.
- 9. And they buried him in the border of his inheritance in Timnathheres, in the mount of Ephraim, on the north side of the hill Gaash.
- 10. And also all that generation were gathered unto their fathers: and there arose another generation after them, which knew not the LORD, nor yet the works which he had done for Israel.
- 11. And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD, and served Baalim:

# **Judges 3**

- 7. And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD, and forgat the LORD their God, and served Baalim and the groves.
- 8. Therefore the anger of the LORD was hot against Israel, and he sold them into the hand of Chushanrishathaim king of Mesopotamia: and the children of Israel served Chushanrishathaim eight years.
- 9. And when the children of Israel cried unto the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer to the children of Israel, who delivered them, [even] Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother.
- 11. And the land had rest forty years. And Othniel the son of Kenaz died.
- 12. And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of the LORD: and the LORD strengthened Eglon the king of Moab against Israel, because they had done evil in the sight of the LORD.
- 14. So the children of Israel served Eglon the king of Moab eighteen years.
- 15. But when the children of Israel cried unto the LORD, the LORD raised them up a

deliverer, Ehud the son of Gera, a Benjamite, a man lefthanded: and by him the children of Israel sent a present unto Eglon the king of Moab.

- 17. And he brought the present unto Eglon king of Moab: and Eglon [was] a very fat man.
- 21. And Ehud put forth his left hand, and took the dagger from his right thigh, and thrust it into his belly:
- 22. And the haft also went in after the blade; and the fat closed upon the blade, so that he could not draw the dagger out of his belly; and the dirt came out.
- 25. And they tarried till they were ashamed: and, behold, he opened not the doors of the parlour; therefore they took a key, and opened [them]: and, behold, their lord [was] fallen down dead on the earth.
- 26. And Ehud escaped while they tarried, and passed beyond the quarries, and escaped unto Seirath.
- 28. And he said unto them, Follow after me: for the LORD hath delivered your enemies the Moabites into your hand. And they went down after him, and took the fords of Jordan toward Moab, and suffered not a man to pass over.
- 30. So Moab was subdued that day under the hand of Israel. And the land had rest fourscore years.

## Judges 4

- 1. And the children of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD, when Ehud was dead.
- 2. And the LORD sold them into the hand of Jabin king of Canaan, that reigned in Hazor; the captain of whose host [was] Sisera, which dwelt in Harosheth of the Gentiles.
- 3. And the children of Israel cried unto the LORD: for he had nine hundred chariots of iron; and twenty years he mightily oppressed the children of Israel.
- 21. Then Jael Heber's wife took a nail of the tent, and took an hammer in her hand, and went softly unto him, and smote the nail into his temples, and fastened it into the ground: for he was fast asleep and weary. So he died.
- 22. And, behold, as Barak pursued Sisera, Jael came out to meet him, and said unto him, Come, and I will shew thee the man whom thou seekest. And when he came into her [tent], behold, Sisera lay dead, and the nail [was] in his temples.
- 23. So God subdued on that day Jabin the king of Canaan before the children of Israel.
- 24. And the hand of the children of Israel prospered, and prevailed against Jabin the king of Canaan, until they had destroyed Jabin king of Canaan.

### **Judges 5**

- 1. Then sang Deborah and Barak the son of Abinoam on that day, saying,
- 31. So let all thine enemies perish, O LORD: but [let] them that love him [be] as the sun when he goeth forth in his might. And the land had rest forty years.

### Judges 6

- 1. And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the LORD: and the LORD delivered them into the hand of Midian seven years.
- 29. And they said one to another, Who hath done this thing? And when they enquired and asked, they said, Gideon the son of Joash hath done this thing.
- 32. Therefore on that day he called him Jerubbaal, saying, Let Baal plead against him, because he hath thrown down his altar.

# Judges 7

7. And the LORD said unto Gideon, By the three hundred men that lapped will I save you, and deliver the Midianites into thine hand: and let all the [other] people go every man unto his place.

# **Judges 8**

- 28. Thus was Midian subdued before the children of Israel, so that they lifted up their heads no more. And the country was in quietness forty years in the days of Gideon.
- 33. And it came to pass, as soon as Gideon was dead, that the children of Israel turned again, and went a whoring after Baalim, and made Baalberith their god.

# **Judges 9**

- 1. And Abimelech the son of Jerubbaal went to Shechem unto his mother's brethren, and communed with them, and with all the family of the house of his mother's father, saying,
- 2. Speak, I pray you, in the ears of all the men of Shechem, Whether [is] better for you, either that all the sons of Jerubbaal, [which are] threescore and ten persons, reign over you, or that one reign over you? remember also that I [am] your bone and your flesh.
- 22. When Abimelech had reigned three years over Israel,
- 50. Then went Abimelech to Thebez, and encamped against Thebez, and took it.
- 51. But there was a strong tower within the city, and thither fled all the men and women, and all they of the city, and shut [it] to them, and gat them up to the top of the tower.
- 52. And Abimelech came unto the tower, and fought against it, and went hard unto the door of the tower to burn it with fire.
- 53. And a certain woman cast a piece of a millstone upon Abimelech's head, and all to brake his skull.
- 54. Then he called hastily unto the young man his armourbearer, and said unto him, Draw thy sword, and slay me, that men say not of me, A woman slew him. And his young man thrust him through, and he died.
- 55. And when the men of Israel saw that Abimelech was dead, they departed every man unto his place.
- 56. Thus God rendered the wickedness of Abimelech, which he did unto his father, in slaying his seventy brethren:

# Judges 10

- 1. And after Abimelech there arose to defend Israel Tola the son of Puah, the son of Dodo, a man of Issachar; and he dwelt in Shamir in mount Ephraim.
- 2. And he judged Israel twenty and three years, and died, and was buried in Shamir.
- 3. And after him arose Jair, a Gileadite, and judged Israel twenty and two years.
- 5. And Jair died, and was buried in Camon.
- 6. And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of the LORD, and served Baalim, and Ashtaroth, and the gods of Syria, and the gods of Zidon, and the gods of Moab, and the gods of the children of Ammon, and the gods of the Philistines, and forsook the LORD, and served not him.
- 7. And the anger of the LORD was hot against Israel, and he sold them into the hands of the Philistines, and into the hands of the children of Ammon.
- 8. And that year they vexed and oppressed the children of Israel: eighteen years, all the children of Israel that [were] on the other side Jordan in the land of the Amorites, which [is] in Gilead.

### Judges 11

- 26. While Israel dwelt in Heshbon and her towns, and in Aroer and her towns, and in all the cities that [be] along by the coasts of Arnon, three hundred years? why therefore did ye not recover [them] within that time?
- 32. So Jephthah passed over unto the children of Ammon to fight against them; and the LORD delivered them into his hands.

# **Judges 12**

- 7. And Jephthah judged Israel six years. Then died Jephthah the Gileadite, and was buried in [one of] the cities of Gilead.
- 8. And after him Ibzan of Bethlehem judged Israel.
- 9. And he had thirty sons, and thirty daughters, [whom] he sent abroad, and took in thirty daughters from abroad for his sons. And he judged Israel seven years.
- 10. Then died Ibzan, and was buried at Bethlehem.
- 11. And after him Elon, a Zebulonite, judged Israel; and he judged Israel ten years.
- 12. And Elon the Zebulonite died, and was buried in Aijalon in the country of Zebulun.
- 13. And after him Abdon the son of Hillel, a Pirathonite, judged Israel.
- 14. And he had forty sons and thirty nephews, that rode on threescore and ten ass colts: and he judged Israel eight years.
- 15. And Abdon the son of Hillel the Pirathonite died, and was buried in Pirathon in the land of Ephraim, in the mount of the Amalekites.

# **Judges 13**

- 1. And the children of Israel did evil again in the sight of the LORD; and the LORD delivered them into the hand of the Philistines forty years.
- 2. And there was a certain man of Zorah, of the family of the Danites, whose name [was] Manoah; and his wife [was] barren, and bare not.
- 24. And the woman bare a son, and called his name Samson: and the child grew, and the LORD blessed him.

# **Judges 16**

- 28. And Samson called unto the LORD, and said, O Lord GOD, remember me, I pray thee, and strengthen me, I pray thee, only this once, O God, that I may be at once avenged of the Philistines for my two eyes.
- 29. And Samson took hold of the two middle pillars upon which the house stood, and on which it was borne up, of the one with his right hand, and of the other with his left.
- 30. And Samson said, Let me die with the Philistines. And he bowed himself with [all his] might; and the house fell upon the lords, and upon all the people that [were] therein. So the dead which he slew at his death were more than [they] which he slew in his life.
- 31. Then his brethren and all the house of his father came down, and took him, and brought [him] up, and buried him between Zorah and Eshtaol in the buryingplace of Manoah his father. And he judged Israel twenty years.

### 1. Samuel 4

- 1. And the word of Samuel came to all Israel. Now Israel went out against the Philistines to battle, and pitched beside Ebenezer: and the Philistines pitched in Aphek.
- 15. Now Eli was ninety and eight years old; and his eyes were dim, that he could not see.
- 18. And it came to pass, when he made mention of the ark of God, that he fell from off the seat backward by the side of the gate, and his neck brake, and he died: for he was an old man, and heavy. And he had judged Israel forty years.

#### 1. Samuel 6

1. And the ark of the LORD was in the country of the Philistines seven months.

### 1. Samuel 7

2. And it came to pass, while the ark abode in Kirjathjearim, that the time was long; for it was twenty years: and all the house of Israel lamented after the LORD.

13. So the Philistines were subdued, and they came no more into the coast of Israel: and the hand of the LORD was against the Philistines all the days of Samuel.

#### 1. Samuel 8

1. And it came to pass, when Samuel was old, that he made his sons judges over Israel.

#### 1. Samuel 9

27. [And] as they were going down to the end of the city, Samuel said to Saul, Bid the servant pass on before us, (and he passed on,) but stand thou still a while, that I may shew thee the word of God.

#### **1. Samuel 10**

1. Then Samuel took a vial of oil, and poured [it] upon his head, and kissed him, and said, [Is it] not because the LORD hath anointed thee [to be] captain over his inheritance?

### **1. Samuel 31**

6. So Saul died, and his three sons, and his armourbearer, and all his men, that same day together.

#### 2. Samuel 2

- 4. And the men of Judah came, and there they anointed David king over the house of Judah. And they told David, saying, [That] the men of Jabeshgilead [were they] that buried Saul.
- 8. But Abner the son of Ner, captain of Saul's host, took Ishbosheth the son of Saul, and brought him over to Mahanaim;
- 9. And made him king over Gilead, and over the Ashurites, and over Jezreel, and over Ephraim, and over Benjamin, and over all Israel.
- 10. Ishbosheth Saul's son [was] forty years old when he began to reign over Israel, and reigned two years. But the house of Judah followed David.

### 2. Samuel 4

8. And they brought the head of Ishbosheth unto David to Hebron, and said to the king, Behold the head of Ishbosheth the son of Saul thine enemy, which sought thy life; and the LORD hath avenged my lord the king this day of Saul, and of his seed.

### 2. Samuel 5

- 1. Then came all the tribes of Israel to David unto Hebron, and spake, saying, Behold, we [are] thy bone and thy flesh.
- 2. Also in time past, when Saul was king over us, thou wast he that leddest out and broughtest in Israel: and the LORD said to thee, Thou shalt feed my people Israel, and thou shalt be a captain over Israel.
- 3. So all the elders of Israel came to the king to Hebron; and king David made a league with them in Hebron before the LORD: and they anointed David king over Israel.
- 4. David [was] thirty years old when he began to reign, [and] he reigned forty years.
- 5. In Hebron he reigned over Judah seven years and six months: and in Jerusalem he reigned thirty and three years over all Israel and Judah.

- 10. So David slept with his fathers, and was buried in the city of David.
- 11. And the days that David reigned over Israel [were] forty years: seven years reigned he in Hebron, and thirty and three years reigned he in Jerusalem.
- 12. Then sat Solomon upon the throne of David his father; and his kingdom was established

greatly.

# **1. Kings 6**

- 1. And it came to pass in the four hundred and eightieth year after the children of Israel were come out of the land of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month Zif, which [is] the second month, that he began to build the house of the LORD.
- 38. And in the eleventh year, in the month Bul, which [is] the eighth month, was the house finished throughout all the parts thereof, and according to all the fashion of it. So was he seven years in building it.

## 1. Kings 11

- 42. And the time that Solomon reigned in Jerusalem over all Israel [was] forty years.
- 43. And Solomon slept with his fathers, and was buried in the city of David his father: and Rehoboam his son reigned in his stead.

# 1. Kings 12

- 20. And it came to pass, when all Israel heard that Jeroboam was come again, that they sent and called him unto the congregation, and made him king over all Israel: there was none that followed the house of David, but the tribe of Judah only.
- 21. And when Rehoboam was come to Jerusalem, he assembled all the house of Judah, with the tribe of Benjamin, an hundred and fourscore thousand chosen men, which were warriors, to fight against the house of Israel, to bring the kingdom again to Rehoboam the son of Solomon.

# 1. Kings 14

- 20. And the days which Jeroboam reigned [were] two and twenty years: and he slept with his fathers, and Nadab his son reigned in his stead.
- 21. And Rehoboam the son of Solomon reigned in Judah. Rehoboam [was] forty and one years old when he began to reign, and he reigned seventeen years in Jerusalem, the city which the LORD did choose out of all the tribes of Israel, to put his name there. And his mother's name [was] Naamah an Ammonitess.
- 31. And Rehoboam slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David. And his mother's name [was] Naamah an Ammonitess. And Abijam his son reigned in his stead.

- 1. Now in the eighteenth year of king Jeroboam the son of Nebat reigned Abijam over Judah.
- 2. Three years reigned he in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Maachah, the daughter of Abishalom.
- 8. And Abijam slept with his fathers; and they buried him in the city of David: and Asa his son reigned in his stead.
- 9. And in the twentieth year of Jeroboam king of Israel reigned Asa over Judah.
- 10. And forty and one years reigned he in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Maachah, the daughter of Abishalom.
- 24. And Asa slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David his father: and Jehoshaphat his son reigned in his stead.
- 25. And Nadab the son of Jeroboam began to reign over Israel in the second year of Asa king of Judah, and reigned over Israel two years.
- 28. Even in the third year of Asa king of Judah did Baasha slay him, and reigned in his stead.
- 33. In the third year of Asa king of Judah began Baasha the son of Ahijah to reign over all Israel in Tirzah, twenty and four years.

- 6. So Baasha slept with his fathers, and was buried in Tirzah: and Elah his son reigned in his stead.
- 8. In the twenty and sixth year of Asa king of Judah began Elah the son of Baasha to reign over Israel in Tirzah, two years.
- 10. And Zimri went in and smote him, and killed him, in the twenty and seventh year of Asa king of Judah, and reigned in his stead.
- 15. In the twenty and seventh year of Asa king of Judah did Zimri reign seven days in Tirzah. And the people [were] encamped against Gibbethon, which [belonged] to the Philistines.
- 16. And the people [that were] encamped heard say, Zimri hath conspired, and hath also slain the king: wherefore all Israel made Omri, the captain of the host, king over Israel that day in the camp.
- 17. And Omri went up from Gibbethon, and all Israel with him, and they besieged Tirzah.
- 18. And it came to pass, when Zimri saw that the city was taken, that he went into the palace of the king's house, and burnt the king's house over him with fire, and died,
- 21. Then were the people of Israel divided into two parts: half of the people followed Tibni the son of Ginath, to make him king; and half followed Omri.
- 22. But the people that followed Omri prevailed against the people that followed Tibni the son of Ginath: so Tibni died, and Omri reigned.
- 23. In the thirty and first year of Asa king of Judah began Omri to reign over Israel, twelve years: six years reigned he in Tirzah.
- 28. So Omri slept with his fathers, and was buried in Samaria: and Ahab his son reigned in his stead.
- 29. And in the thirty and eighth year of Asa king of Judah began Ahab the son of Omri to reign over Israel: and Ahab the son of Omri reigned over Israel in Samaria twenty and two years.

# 1. Kings 17

1. And Elijah the Tishbite, [who was] of the inhabitants of Gilead, said unto Ahab, [As] the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.

### 1. Kings 22

- 40. So Ahab slept with his fathers; and Ahaziah his son reigned in his stead.
- 41. And Jehoshaphat the son of Asa began to reign over Judah in the fourth year of Ahab king of Israel
- 42. Jehoshaphat [was] thirty and five years old when he began to reign; and he reigned twenty and five years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Azubah the daughter of Shilhi.
- 51. And Jehoshaphat slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David his father: and Jehoram his son reigned in his stead.
- 52. Ahaziah the son of Ahab began to reign over Israel in Samaria the seventeenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah, and reigned two years over Israel.

- 17. So he died according to the word of the LORD which Elijah had spoken. And Jehoram reigned in his stead in the second year of Jehoram the son of Jehoshaphat king of Judah; because he had no son.
- 18. Now the rest of the acts of Ahaziah which he did, [are] they not written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of Israel?

- 1. And it came to pass, when the LORD would take up Elijah into heaven by a whirlwind, that Elijah went with Elisha from Gilgal.
- 9. And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, Ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee. And Elisha said, I pray thee, let a double portion of thy spirit be upon me.
- 10. And he said, Thou hast asked a hard thing: [nevertheless], if thou see me [when I am] taken from thee, it shall be so unto thee; but if not, it shall not be [so].
- 11. And it came to pass, as they still went on, and talked, that, behold, [there appeared] a chariot of fire, and horses of fire, and parted them both asunder; and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.
- 12. And Elisha saw [it], and he cried, My father, my father, the chariot of Israel, and the horsemen thereof. And he saw him no more: and he took hold of his own clothes, and rent them in two pieces.
- 13. He took up also the mantle of Elijah that fell from him, and went back, and stood by the bank of Jordan;
- 14. And he took the mantle of Elijah that fell from him, and smote the waters, and said, Where [is] the LORD God of Elijah? and when he also had smitten the waters, they parted hither and thither: and Elisha went over.
- 15. And when the sons of the prophets which [were] to view at Jericho saw him, they said, The spirit of Elijah doth rest on Elisha. And they came to meet him, and bowed themselves to the ground before him.

# **2. Kings 3**

1. Now Jehoram the son of Ahab began to reign over Israel in Samaria the eighteenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah, and reigned twelve years.

# 2. Kings 8

- 16. And in the fifth year of Joram the son of Ahab king of Israel, Jehoshaphat [being] then king of Judah, Jehoram the son of Jehoshaphat king of Judah began to reign.
- 17. Thirty and two years old was he when he began to reign; and he reigned eight years in Jerusalem.
- 24. And Joram slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David: and Ahaziah his son reigned in his stead.
- 25. In the twelfth year of Joram the son of Ahab king of Israel did Ahaziah the son of Jehoram king of Judah begin to reign.
- 26. Two and twenty years old [was] Ahaziah when he began to reign; and he reigned one year in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Athaliah, the daughter of Omri king of Israel.

- 14. So Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi conspired against Joram. (Now Joram had kept Ramothgilead, he and all Israel, because of Hazael king of Syria.
- 23. And Joram turned his hands, and fled, and said to Ahaziah, [There is] treachery, O Ahaziah.
- 24. And Jehu drew a bow with his full strength, and smote Jehoram between his arms, and the arrow went out at his heart, and he sunk down in his chariot.
- 27. But when Ahaziah the king of Judah saw [this], he fled by the way of the garden house. And Jehu followed after him, and said, Smite him also in the chariot. [And they did so] at the going up to Gur, which [is] by Ibleam. And he fled to Megiddo, and died there.
- 29. And in the eleventh year of Joram the son of Ahab began Ahaziah to reign over Judah.

- 35. And Jehu slept with his fathers: and they buried him in Samaria. And Jehoahaz his son reigned in his stead.
- 36. And the time that Jehu reigned over Israel in Samaria [was] twenty and eight years.

### 2. Kings 11

- 1. And when Athaliah the mother of Ahaziah saw that her son was dead, she arose and destroyed all the seed royal.
- 2. But Jehosheba, the daughter of king Joram, sister of Ahaziah, took Joash the son of Ahaziah, and stole him from among the king's sons [which were] slain; and they hid him, [even] him and his nurse, in the bedchamber from Athaliah, so that he was not slain.
- 3. And he was with her hid in the house of the LORD six years. And Athaliah did reign over the land.
- 20. And all the people of the land rejoiced, and the city was in quiet: and they slew Athaliah with the sword [beside] the king's house.
- 21. Seven years old [was] Jehoash when he began to reign.

# 2. Kings 12

- 1. In the seventh year of Jehu Jehoash began to reign; and forty years reigned he in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Zibiah of Beersheba.
- 19. And the rest of the acts of Joash, and all that he did, [are] they not written in the book of the chronicles of the kings of Judah?
- 21. For Jozachar the son of Shimeath, and Jehozabad the son of Shomer, his servants, smote him, and he died; and they buried him with his fathers in the city of David: and Amaziah his son reigned in his stead.

# 2. Kings 13

- 1. In the three and twentieth year of Joash the son of Ahaziah king of Judah Jehoahaz the son of Jehu began to reign over Israel in Samaria, [and reigned] seventeen years.
- 9. And Jehoahaz slept with his fathers; and they buried him in Samaria: and Joash his son reigned in his stead.
- 10. In the thirty and seventh year of Joash king of Judah began Jehoash the son of Jehoahaz to reign over Israel in Samaria, [and reigned] sixteen years.
- 14. Now Elisha was fallen sick of his sickness whereof he died. And Joash the king of Israel came down unto him, and wept over his face, and said, O my father, my father, the chariot of Israel, and the horsemen thereof.
- 20. And Elisha died, and they buried him. And the bands of the Moabites invaded the land at the coming in of the year.
- 22. But Hazael king of Syria oppressed Israel all the days of Jehoahaz.
- 25. And Jehoash the son of Jehoahaz took again out of the hand of Benhadad the son of Hazael the cities, which he had taken out of the hand of Jehoahaz his father by war. Three times did Joash beat him, and recovered the cities of Israel.

- 1. In the second year of Joash son of Jehoahaz king of Israel reigned Amaziah the son of Joash king of Judah.
- 2. He was twenty and five years old when he began to reign, and reigned twenty and nine years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Jehoaddan of Jerusalem.
- 16. And Jehoash slept with his fathers, and was buried in Samaria with the kings of Israel; and Jeroboam his son reigned in his stead.

- 17. And Amaziah the son of Joash king of Judah lived after the death of Jehoash son of Jehoahaz king of Israel fifteen years.
- 19. Now they made a conspiracy against him in Jerusalem: and he fled to Lachish; but they sent after him to Lachish, and slew him there.
- 21. And all the people of Judah took Azariah, which [was] sixteen years old, and made him king instead of his father Amaziah.
- 23. In the fifteenth year of Amaziah the son of Joash king of Judah Jeroboam the son of Joash king of Israel began to reign in Samaria, [and reigned] forty and one years.
- 29. And Jeroboam slept with his fathers, [even] with the kings of Israel; and Zachariah his son reigned in his stead.

- 1. In the twenty and seventh year of Jeroboam king of Israel began Azariah son of Amaziah king of Judah to reign.
- 2. Sixteen years old was he when he began to reign, and he reigned two and fifty years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Jecholiah of Jerusalem.
- 5. And the LORD smote the king, so that he was a leper unto the day of his death, and dwelt in a several house. And Jotham the king's son [was] over the house, judging the people of the land.
- 7. So Azariah slept with his fathers; and they buried him with his fathers in the city of David: and Jotham his son reigned in his stead.
- 8. In the thirty and eighth year of Azariah king of Judah did Zachariah the son of Jeroboam reign over Israel in Samaria six months.
- 10. And Shallum the son of Jabesh conspired against him, and smote him before the people, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.
- 13. Shallum the son of Jabesh began to reign in the nine and thirtieth year of Uzziah king of Judah; and he reigned a full month in Samaria.
- 14. For Menahem the son of Gadi went up from Tirzah, and came to Samaria, and smote Shallum the son of Jabesh in Samaria, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.
- 17. In the nine and thirtieth year of Azariah king of Judah began Menahem the son of Gadi to reign over Israel, [and reigned] ten years in Samaria.
- 22. And Menahem slept with his fathers; and Pekahiah his son reigned in his stead.
- 23. In the fiftieth year of Azariah king of Judah Pekahiah the son of Menahem began to reign over Israel in Samaria, [and reigned] two years.
- 25. But Pekah the son of Remaliah, a captain of his, conspired against him, and smote him in Samaria, in the palace of the king's house, with Argob and Arieh, and with him fifty men of the Gileadites: and he killed him, and reigned in his room.
- 27. In the two and fiftieth year of Azariah king of Judah Pekah the son of Remaliah began to reign over Israel in Samaria, [and reigned] twenty years.
- 30. And Hoshea the son of Elah made a conspiracy against Pekah the son of Remaliah, and smote him, and slew him, and reigned in his stead, in the twentieth year of Jotham the son of Uzziah.
- 32. In the second year of Pekah the son of Remaliah king of Israel began Jotham the son of Uzziah king of Judah to reign.
- 33. Five and twenty years old was he when he began to reign, and he reigned sixteen years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Jerusha, the daughter of Zadok.
- 38. And Jotham slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David his father: and Ahaz his son reigned in his stead.

### 2. Kings 16

1. In the seventeenth year of Pekah the son of Remaliah Ahaz the son of Jotham king of

Judah began to reign.

- 2. Twenty years old [was] Ahaz when he began to reign, and reigned sixteen years in Jerusalem, and did not [that which was] right in the sight of the LORD his God, like David his father.
- 20. And Ahaz slept with his fathers, and was buried with his fathers in the city of David: and Hezekiah his son reigned in his stead.

# 2. Kings 17

- 1. In the twelfth year of Ahaz king of Judah began Hoshea the son of Elah to reign in Samaria over Israel nine years.
- 6. In the ninth year of Hoshea the king of Assyria took Samaria, and carried Israel away into Assyria, and placed them in Halah and in Habor [by] the river of Gozan, and in the cities of the Medes.

# 2. Kings 18

- 1. Now it came to pass in the third year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, [that] Hezekiah the son of Ahaz king of Judah began to reign.
- 2. Twenty and five years old was he when he began to reign; and he reigned twenty and nine years in Jerusalem. His mother's name also [was] Abi, the daughter of Zachariah.
- 10. And at the end of three years they took it: [even] in the sixth year of Hezekiah, that [is] the ninth year of Hoshea king of Israel, Samaria was taken.
- 13. Now in the fourteenth year of king Hezekiah did Sennacherib king of Assyria come up against all the fenced cities of Judah, and took them.

# 2. Kings 19

29. And this [shall be] a sign unto thee, Ye shall eat this year such things as grow of themselves, and in the second year that which springeth of the same; and in the third year sow ye, and reap, and plant vineyards, and eat the fruits thereof.

# 2. Kings 20

21. And Hezekiah slept with his fathers: and Manasseh his son reigned in his stead.

# 2. Kings 21

- 1. Manasseh [was] twelve years old when he began to reign, and reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Hephzibah.
- 18. And Manasseh slept with his fathers, and was buried in the garden of his own house, in the garden of Uzza: and Amon his son reigned in his stead.
- 19. Amon [was] twenty and two years old when he began to reign, and he reigned two years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Meshullemeth, the daughter of Haruz of Jotbah.
- 24. And the people of the land slew all them that had conspired against king Amon; and the people of the land made Josiah his son king in his stead.

# 2. Kings 22

1. Josiah [was] eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty and one years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Jedidah, the daughter of Adaiah of Boscath.

# 2. Kings 23

30. And his servants carried him in a chariot dead from Megiddo, and brought him to Jerusalem, and buried him in his own sepulchre. And the people of the land took Jehoahaz the son of Josiah, and anointed him, and made him king in his father's stead.

- 31. Jehoahaz [was] twenty and three years old when he began to reign; and he reigned three months in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Hamutal, the daughter of Jeremiah of Libnah.
- 34. And Pharaohnechoh made Eliakim the son of Josiah king in the room of Josiah his father, and turned his name to Jehoiakim, and took Jehoahaz away: and he came to Egypt, and died there.
- 36. Jehoiakim [was] twenty and five years old when he began to reign; and he reigned eleven years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Zebudah, the daughter of Pedaiah of Rumah.

- 6. So Jehoiakim slept with his fathers: and Jehoiachin his son reigned in his stead.
- 8. Jehoiachin [was] eighteen years old when he began to reign, and he reigned in Jerusalem three months. And his mother's name [was] Nehushta, the daughter of Elnathan of Jerusalem.
- 15. And he carried away Jehoiachin to Babylon, and the king's mother, and the king's wives, and his officers, and the mighty of the land, [those] carried he into captivity from Jerusalem to Babylon.
- 17. And the king of Babylon made Mattaniah his father's brother king in his stead, and changed his name to Zedekiah.
- 18. Zedekiah [was] twenty and one years old when he began to reign, and he reigned eleven years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name [was] Hamutal, the daughter of Jeremiah of Libnah.

### 2. Chronicles 9

- 30. And Solomon reigned in Jerusalem over all Israel forty years.
- 31. And Solomon slept with his fathers, and he was buried in the city of David his father: and Rehoboam his son reigned in his stead.

### 2. Chronicles 12

- 13. So king Rehoboam strengthened himself in Jerusalem, and reigned: for Rehoboam [was] one and forty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned seventeen years in Jerusalem, the city which the LORD had chosen out of all the tribes of Israel, to put his name there. And his mother's name [was] Naamah an Ammonitess.
- 16. And Rehoboam slept with his fathers, and was buried in the city of David: and Abijah his son reigned in his stead.

### 2. Chronicles 13

1. Now in the eighteenth year of king Jeroboam began Abijah to reign over Judah.

### 2. Chronicles 14

1. So Abijah slept with his fathers, and they buried him in the city of David: and Asa his son reigned in his stead. In his days the land was quiet ten years.

## 2. Chronicles 22

12. And he was with them hid in the house of God six years: and Athaliah reigned over the land.

# 2. Chronicles 24

27. Now [concerning] his sons, and the greatness of the burdens [laid] upon him, and the repairing of the house of God, behold, they [are] written in the story of the book of the kings. And Amaziah his son reigned in his stead.

#### 2. Chronicles 25

- 1. Manasseh [was] twelve years old when he began to reign, and he reigned fifty and five years in Jerusalem:
- 20. So Manasseh slept with his fathers, and they buried him in his own house: and Amon his son reigned in his stead.
- 21. Amon [was] two and twenty years old when he began to reign, and reigned two years in Jerusalem.
- 25. But the people of the land slew all them that had conspired against king Amon; and the people of the land made Josiah his son king in his stead.

### 2. Chronicles 34

1. Josiah [was] eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned in Jerusalem one and thirty years.

# 4. Example of Calculation

#### 4.1. Motivation

To demonstrate that the expense of calculation tolerances is necessary to understand the biblical chronology, an extreme simple example of calculation is given.

# 4.2. Needed Text Passages

To that the following text passages of the biblical chronology are to be used:

Genesis 5:32 Genesis 7:11 Genesis 8:13 Genesis 8:14 Genesis 11:10

Here the references of calculation in most cases are the years in the age of Noah thus there is a possibility of corresponding conversion to the rest of dates.

#### 4.3. Contradiction for Inaccurate Persons

The statements of the text passages give the calculation: 500 + 100 = 601 + 2

This is an inconsistent statement based on the fact that the character of ordinal numbers of the given dates has not been taken into consideration. Further there is the possibility to relate the statement "two years after the flood" to the beginning and not to the end of the same.

# 4.4. Calculation of Intervals of an Event

To avoid a separation of cases where a certain numbers is discussed depending on the situative context once as an ordinal number and once as an integer number, the limits of dates are determined that are given by the possibility of interpretation.

The absolute value of time increases while time is running. The reason of this is that a human only can remember past times and not future times. Measurements always are possible in present time only. Thus an unequivocal fixing of maximum and minimum date of an events has been given.

Because of pragmatical reasons the calculation is done in years of 12 months à 30 days. This concept also has found an application in financial mathematics on calculating interest – however by this there are days without interest in a year. On calculating chronologies this concept leads to intervals of event being a little bit too large or surely to contradictions respectively.

# 4.5. Choose of Tolerances

An ordinal number n describes the interval between (n-1) and n, where in this connection overlapping intervals of neighboured numbers are allowed.

On Persian dates there is a year of accession being followed by the first year of government. Also at the Chaldean Nebuchadnezzar the passages of the Bible text in the book of Daniel show the possibility of this calculation method where after three years of education the second year of Nebuchadnezzar was arrived (Daniel 1:1,5; 2:1). Thus this means an interval between n and (n+1).

A tolerance without distinguishing special cases thus leads to a tolerance interval  $(n\pm 1)$  if a least unit with integer measuring number n is used. In opposite to physical-technical measurements there is no possibility of repeating in history and therefore no "most probable value", too. A tolerance of the kind " $\pm$ " in history does in its content not relate to a statistical scattering, but to the arithmetical means of a calculated interval. The calculation of a chronological table always can be managed by discussing interval limits only.

Thus in the given example the following tolerances are acceptable whereby a stricter interpretation ("-" instead of "±") is possible and can be confirmed by the result of the calculation:

Genesis 5:32:  $500 (\pm ? 1)$  years

Genesis 7:11: 599 years, 1 month, 17 (±? 1) day

Genesis 8:13:  $600 \text{ years}, (\pm? 1) \text{ day}$ 

Genesis 8:14: 600 years, 1 month, 27  $(\pm$ ? 1) days Genesis 11:10: 100  $(\pm$ ? 1) years, further 2  $(\pm$ ? 1) years

# 4.6. Changing of the Tolerances within the Result by the Algorithm

The birth of Noah's grandchild has happend in the  $100^{th}$  year of Sem whereby because of the conversion into the years of Noah an addition of the tolerances takes place. Thus the birth gets the interval 500+100 ( $\pm$ ? 2) years, in detail between 598 and 602.

A further access to this result is the second year after the flood which – as already indicated – has got the following three alternatives of interpretation:

```

The intersection of the intervals calculated so far is the result of the birth of Noah's grandchild whereby at the latest here a dating with "±" is disturbing. The three possible intersections are given as a mimimum and maximum date in the age of Noah whereby a direct source leading to this accuracy of chronology does not exist where a contradiction is avoided yet.

In all three cases a sensible interval has been calculated. Thus even a strict interpretation of the statement "two years AFTER the flood" is allowed not leading to a contradiction by narrower tolerances. This interpretation is consistent and fits best to the context of the text – at least in English. Nevertheless without further text sources a free play with interpretation results containing distinguishing of cases. Depending on diligence and intention of the worker an explained choice of the possibilities found can take place or not.

More important than the combinatorical explosion of dating possibilities is a careful reduction of the tolerances which base the calculation. Finally a checking calculation to the elaborated result must be independent of the calculation way and give a true result. Now an intersection has been done to find the dates thus a reduced tolerance results for the dates in the age of Noah, too.

Also the age of Noah itself depends on other ages (e.g. the age of Adam or the Israelian calendar) when a coherent chronology is calculated.

To be not too complicated, here the strict interpretation to dating back and its consequences is presented, whereby the tolerances have been interpreted as "±":

The dates based to, in three cases have not been changed at the tolerance, in opposite to the first case. Each correction of a date of course needs further checking calculations until no correction is necessary yet.

In general dates are not presented as a system of integer numbers, but of ordinal numbers where no zeroth element exists. Therefore the yielded time differences to a base point are presented as ordinal numbers, seeming to be "moved":

# Pay attention to the following:

The maximum limit of the 501<sup>st</sup> birthday of Noah according to the interpretation of the context clearly has become a too great limit. If with this limit there is a contradiction, then surely a discrepancy within the datings is localized.

If the values of Noah's age are given as pre-determined datings of a chronology, the tolerances might be narrower in this case, namely at the value given in first. Pre-determined datings must not be changed by a calculated dating back in any case!

It is important to stress that now the basic algorithm has been desribed to calculate a historical time-table, especially of the old ages leading to a working computer program. Especially arithmetics of ordinal numbers needs a lot of care in programming. Adding of tolerances is to happen depending on the situative context once "inwardly" and once "outwardly" related to

the limits having no tolerance.

To build up a working computer program needs a crew of some researchers that explain and correct their kind of work to each other. Further special tasks of possible program users are to be taken into account to yield that at the end all users are satisfied. There is a need of help texts within the program and of the possibility to present intermediate results or source data at the right position in a transparent way. The building up of the program has been successful if an interested historian needs less time to elaborate and correct a chronological time-table than by hand-working. This can be yielded especially if there are already some data bases of historical source. Anyway this helps to avoid long-time mistakes of writing and calculation.

For teaching also in informatics, the biblical chronology is indeed proper, because there is a handling of data bases, simple mathematical algorithms and complicated combinatorics. The art of historical calendars based on historical sources is a sensible and also necessary addition or correction respectively to astronomical and other methods of dating, because by this measured data of past times is evaluated which of course is more precise than extrapolations of today's measurement in each case. The use of a computer is not necessary to work on the historical chronologies as explained here, but especially a certain help on trouble shooting and giving corrections.

# 4.7. Handling with Discrepancies

A contradictional dating occurs only, if the maximum value in spite of all possible tolerances is less than the minimum value calculated for at least one event. This kind of problem for the first time is a hint to interprete the source alternatively, and after exhausting such possibilities it is a localized discrepancy. The question since when a localized discrepancy is to be considered as a refutation, has been answered the following by Moses in commission of the LORD:

15. One witness shall not rise up against a man for any iniquity, or for any sin, in any sin that he sinneth: at the mouth of two witnesses, or at the mouth of three witnesses, shall the matter be established.

(Deuteronomy 19:15)

In Germany at the latest since the exaggerate "exactness" of the "pure ratio" due to Kant this concept of argumentation has been hardly fighted against thus an implacable quarrelsomeness of mathematicians and other philosophers has been started. They emphasize logical presentation, but not contentional argumentation. Therefore the question whether 1 + 1 = 2 is valid has become a criterion on exclusion of all having another opinion – independently of the situative context.

In the arrangement of chronologies and also in technical physics a measured value cannot have tolerance Zero. If a historical source is interpreted seriously, there is to note that datings, e.g. given in an accuracy of a day, do not mention whether the beginning or the end of the limiting day is delt with. As a well-known example to this misinterpretation have a look on the fact that the Lord Christ Jesus has been cruzified on Good Friday due to the tradition of the Roman catholics especially in "Lutherean" orthodoxy, and is risen from death on Easter Sunday. This has been the third day, because ordinal numbers have got another kind of calculation than integer numbers. There are also representatives of the opinion that cruzifixion took place on a Thursday whereby the 15<sup>th</sup> Nisan due to an alternative discussion of new moon has been a Friday being counted as a "Sabbath" because of the Passover. Also this

interpretation can be presented logically and proven by cites of the sources thus resurrection has taken place after three days. Sunday as the day of resurrection of Christ Jesus is contested only to those who do not want to believe the witnesses of resurrection, a tradition of resurrection on Monday does not exist or be provable by the Bible text.

Presence of several interpretation variants should not yield a battle of faith, but lead to care on dealing with historical sources. Also in this case noticing of tolerances helps to deal with different being conclusions. This is a hint that the thinking due to Kant has got its origin in a narrow-minded dogmatism being the pretext also in Germany to "persecution of heretics" against all having another opinion, especially against those who were teaching to repent sins. The way of Chist Jesus in spite of all this consists in suffering of the discrepancy until it will be cleared by further witnesses.

The keeping of an opinion that has turned out to be incorrect has been recommended nowhere in the Holy Bible. Moreover also the gentiles have been invited to reject their wrong idols and to follow Chist Jesus. Also the idol "ratio" or "human logic" and its consequences has been dealt with being rejected in the first chapter of the epistle to the Romans.
